

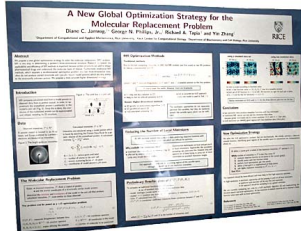

Student Poster Session



The Military Operations Research Society (MORS) Education and Professional Development Colloquium will include a Poster Competition that is designed to allow greater participation among Graduate and Undergraduate students who may not be able to attend the colloquium as well as provide students at the colloquium a chance to showcase their work.

Who May Enter The Competition?

Any graduate or undergraduate student of a school that is participating in the MORS EPD Colloquium. Additionally, students that are unable to attend the colloquium are eligible to participate. Posters may represent individual or group research. Given the timing of the colloquium, incomplete research is welcome.

Deadlines for Submission

An abstract must be submitted by email to LTC Dan McCarthy (Daniel.McCarthy@usma.edu) no later than 14 March 2012. Authors of accepted posters will be notified by 21 March 2012 with specific poster requirements (e.g. poster size). Final poster submissions can either be brought to the colloquium or else must be submitted electronically no later than 6 April 2012. Additionally, authors of accepted posters will need to complete a presentation disclosure form (either a 712A or 712B) which must be submitted to the MORS office by fax or email no later than 1 April 2012.

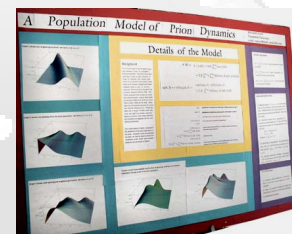

Competition

Posters will be on display throughout the colloquium (electronic submissions will be printed and displayed as well). Your challenge is to create a poster that effectively communicates the goals, objectives, methods and results of your work. The poster competition will include a question and answer period during which students will be required to defend their work to the judges. Students in attendance at the colloquium will be scheduled for a time to defend their poster in person. Those students competing in the poster competition but who are unable to attend the colloquium will be scheduled for an individual teleconference with the judges. The judging will be based on creativity, explanation of the problem, solution methodology, and recommended solutions as well as your responses to the questions of the judges. Winners will be announced at the conclusion of the colloquium.
